1. Introduction

Hydrology and Water Resources Services Division (HWRSD) is one of the four Divisions of the Center, responsible for generating and disseminating information and services related to hydrology and water resources.





Figure 1 Map showing the selected stations for Flow monitoring

The Division collects and archives daily data from the river gauging station located across the country, to keep updated on the status of the flow, the Division is coming up with Monthly Flow Monitoring Report in selected hydrological stations located in different river basins. Currently, following stations (figure 1) are selected for monthly monitoring of the flow;

- 1. Lungtenphu station in Wangchhu,
- 2. Kerabari station in Punatsangchhu basin
- 3. Kurjey station in Chamkharchhu basin and
- 4. Wangdirapids station in Punatsangchu basin.

The main objective of the report is to understand and keep updated flow status of the river and further provide information on the abnormal data observation while comparing with the historical flow data.

2. Methodology

The flow of September 2021 is compared to the flow of historical September months. The historical flow data is available from 1991 to 2020. The measures of dispersion such as mean, maximum and minimum flows are computed to make comparison.

3. Observation

The mean flow recorded for the month of September 2021 was $101.05m^3/s$ which is higher than the mean of Historical September months (i.e. $99.07m^3/s$). Maximum flow of September 2021 (i.e. $163m^3/s$) was observed to be lesser than the maximum flow observed in the past September months (i.e. $290.34m^3/s$). Meanwhile Minimum flow of September 2021 ($68.54m^3/s$) was observed to be higher than the past September months ($48.75m^3/s$).

4. Summary

- 1. The mean flow of September 2021 is observed to be 1.98m³/s higher as compared to the mean of Normal flow (Historical September).
- 2. The minimum flow is observed to be higher by $19.79 \text{m}^3/\text{s}$ for September 2021 compared to the minimum flow observed in the past for September months.
- 3. The Maximum flow of September 2021 was observed to be lesser than the maximum flow observed in the past September months by $127.34m^3/s$.
